Access to this platform is available – at no additional cost – to institutions with one or more Gale historical newspaper and periodical collections. Users are therefore able to search or browse across multiple products offered by their institution.

Users can also browse by title and place of publication and can read newspapers cover-to-cover in full screen or – using an advanced image viewer – save, print, highlight, bookmark, grab, pan, zoom and crop content pages.



### Evolution of *The Times*

In the late 1990s, the weekday editions of *The Times* began to include a new daily supplement: Times2. The "T2" supplement contained feature articles, rather than regular news. Other weekly supplements were introduced in this period as well, including "Bricks and Mortar" (property), "The Game" (football), and various Saturday supplements (including the magazine and Saturday Review).

*The Times* also expanded the page count of individual issues in this period, adding more and more content to the main section. In 2004, it switched from broadsheet to tabloid format, shrinking the shape of the newspaper, but increasing the number of pages: a smaller newspaper, but larger issues.

*The Times Digital Archive* spans a wealth of subjects – it is a truly multi-disciplinary resource.

| Subject                | Examples of topics covered  |
|------------------------|---|
| Science and Technology | The invention of the telephone, the telegraph, a huge number of home appliances, and space exploration, the internet, mobile phones, cloning.   |
| Geopolitics            | The Russian revolution, the creation of Israel, the end of the Cold War, and the rise of global terrorism.  |
| War                    | The Crimean War, the two World Wars, the Vietnam War, the collapse of Yugoslavia, the Gulf Wars and the conflict in Afghanistan.  |
| Disasters              | The sinking of the Titanic, the San Francisco earthquake of 1906, Rwandan genocide, the Boxing Day tsunami, and the Kobe earthquake.  |
| Politics               | The civil rights movement, the suffrage movement, the Thatcher-Major-Blair years in the UK, and the second Reagan administration to the George W Bush presidency in the USA.  |
| Sport                  | Coverage of Olympic games and major sports tournaments, plus controversial sports stories such as Roger Bannister's sub-four minute mile and Ben Johnson's drug fuelled win in Seoul in 1988.   |
| Economics              | The Industrial Revolution, the Great Depression, the Savings and Loan crisis, the growth of China as a financial power, and the Asian banking crisis.   |
| Business               | The Industrial Revolution, the dotcom bubble, the rise of Microsoft and Apple.  |
| Culture                | The trial of Oscar Wilde, the death of Elvis Presley, the emergence of rock and roll and the 'kinema' (later known as cinema), the rise of the paperback book, the Young British Artists movement, hip-hop music entering mainstream culture. |

## The new interface

Enhanced features include:

- **Citation generation** – users can now automatically create citations and export them to 3rd party bibliographic software, such as EndNote and RefWorks
- **Named user functionality** – a Gale account allows users to save searches and marked items across sessions
- **New image viewer** – ability to manipulate images more easily and view articles and whole pages full screen
- **Wider variety of printing options** – making printing awkward size articles much easier
