History Resource Center: U.S. provides a complete overview of U.S. history and covers the most-studied events, issues and current information. It combines documents from Primary Source Microfilm's™ digital archives; articles from classic Macmillan Reference USA™ and Charles Scribner's Sons® references; as well as other Gale proprietary content such as country and era overview information, and full-text periodicals and journals.

CATEGORIZED RESULTS SIMPLIFY RESEARCH

History Resource Center: U.S. offers extensive cross-references with attention paid to the natural research process and ease of use. Additionally, search results are displayed by data type, which is helpful in projects requiring students to locate a certain number of primary source documents, secondary sources or periodicals. Information is accessed through five main search paths: person, time period, subject, full text and custom search, and are organized by the following data types:

- Annotated chronology with U.S. and world context
- Articles, essays and biographies on U.S. and world history topics, eras, etc.
