#### **Detailed Overview**

**SUMMARY:** With its 1842 debut, The Illustrated London News became the world's first fully illustrated weekly newspaper, marking a revolution in journalism. The publication presented a vivid picture of British and world events – including eyewitness accounts of war, descriptions of natural disasters, and reviews of arts and science.

**SIGNIFICANCE:** With its sweeping coverage of historical, social and cultural milestones, *The Illustrated London News Historical Archive* supports disciplines ranging from politics and economics to graphics and science. Use this collection as a foundation for scholars seeking primary sources, one-of-a-kind images and on-the-scene narratives.

**SOURCE:** The Illustrated London News was founded by Herbert Ingram, an entrepreneurial newsagent who noticed that newspapers sold more copies when they carried pictures. The inaugural issue covered a fire in Hamburg, Queen Victoria's costume ball, the war in Afghanistan and the latest fashions in Paris. The publication commissioned a galaxy of great artists and illustrators to cover wars, royal events, scientific invention and exploration. In 1855 it launched the world's first color supplement, further cementing The Illustrated London News as a publishing innovator.

**STRUCTURE:** In *The Illustrated London News Historical Archive, 1842-2003*, Gale grants students, researchers and enthusiasts unprecedented online access to the entire 160-year run of the newspaper.
